- - The content should be single-spaced, on A4 page size, in12 point font size, and Times New Roman font type, in Word or RTF format;
- 3. A Conference paper should consists of the following:
  - Title of the paper
  - Name(s) of author/s, their Institution, city and country
  - Abstract of approximately 200 words, summarizing the presentation along with key words
  - Full text
- 4. The minimum length is 3 pages and the maximum length of papers is 10 pages (single-spaced A4).
